




- Operates by matching travelers with persons needing a delivery.
- Global crowd shipping, with deliveries made involving 60 countries on 6 continents.
- At time of writing has 1995 open deliveries and 1764 open trips.
- Nearly all have a destination or an origin of Russia or Ukraine.
- Prices available in U.S. Dollars range from \$5 to \$200.

- Matches delivery request with travelers, service does not act as an intermediary.
- Allows users to post both future travels and deliveries.
- Shipments of foodstuff, documents and pets are the most common varieties.
- "Website using the unique algorithm finds the person who travels the desired route and vice versa."
- Any compensation is negotiated between the two parties.




- Medium of use is via the web, having both a desktop and mobile version.
- Some parts of the website are only available in Russian.
- Generally a good website, with helpful FAQ section, lengthy legal sections.
- "At the moment, the service is free", hints that a fee or commission could eventually be charge.
- The travelers assumes all risk for product during transit, has no recourse if delivery is refused except posting negative review.
- Doesn't offer an escrow like other international crowdshipping services, the traveler assumes responsibility for the cargo while in transit.



- Has over 10,000 combined followers on numerous types of social media.
- Over 3,000 Followers on twitter.
- 2,300 likes and 2,200 followers on facebook.
- Largest traction is in Russia, Ukraine,
 U.S., and Belarus.
- Website is available in both English and Russian.





- Has a page dedicated to international items Russian users would like to buy and where to buy them at.
